

Tasmania's hospital and aged care visitor restrictions

Public hospital patient visitation

All visitors are required to complete a visitor screening prior to entering the hospital.

Visiting hours are between
2pm–6pm daily.

Visitors are limited to a maximum of one patient at any one time. There might be an exception to this rule at some hospital wards or locations, contact the hospital directly if you want to ask for an exception.

Aged care visits

You can visit aged care facilities and residents are able to leave for outings with friends and family.

A maximum of two people can visit a resident at a time, staying as long as they wish (subject to the facility's own policies).

Multiple visits each day are allowed and there are no age limits on visitors.

Visitors must have an up-to-date flu vaccine and will be screened before entry.

Do not visit if you:



Have been interstate or overseas in the past 14 days



Are displaying symptoms of respiratory infection or have a temperature higher than 37.5 degrees



Have had contact within the past 14 days with a person diagnosed with COVID-19, or reasonably suspected of having COVID-19
